Yamaha Grand Sports Festival Gigantic Summer Pageant of Motorcyclists

Yamaha organized a grand meeting of motorcycle enthusiasts at the Foot of Mt. Fuji, and at Hakone, famous resort some 80km west of Tokyo under the designation of 'Yamaha Grand Sports Festival' during a 2-day period from August 5. It turned out to be a gigantic summer pageant by some 80,000 motorcycle enthusiasts in total.

The objective of this grand meeting was to popularize Yamaha's motto 'Safe and Pleasurable Motorcycling' through sport events such as road race and motocross, Yamaha-original rider education schools, motorcycle spot shows and other various enjoyable events. 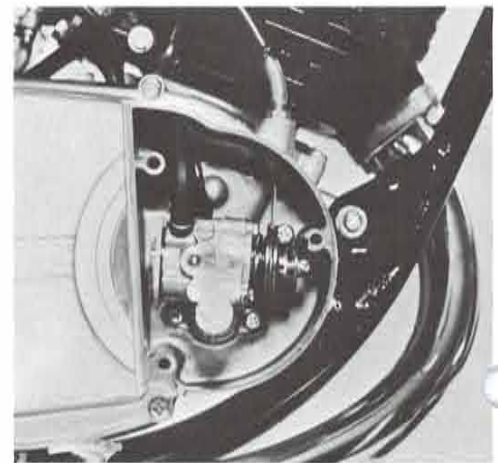

Yamaha 100 Street LS3

Lightweight Torque Induction Model



The Yamaha 100 Street LS3 has made its market debut as the noteworthy 100cc lightweight street model which features the Yamaha-developed 7-port single cylinder Torque Induction engine, as already proven excellent with the Yamaha Trail models, the Torque Induction engine has noticeably improved output at low and medium speeds.

The LS3 is equipped with the rugged double cradle type frame to guarantee marginal durability and maneuverability against vibrations at high speeds, and shocks from rough road surfaces.

The adoption of a link type shaft pedal assures quick effortless gear shifts with the best riding position maintained. Cylinder fins have been made larger in radiation area for better heat dissipation, and shaped like those of motocross machine's cylinder to minimize dust deposits around fins. Besides, included in refinements introduced are an air cleaner of new design for higher intake efficiency, and a new stoplamp for improved safety, too.

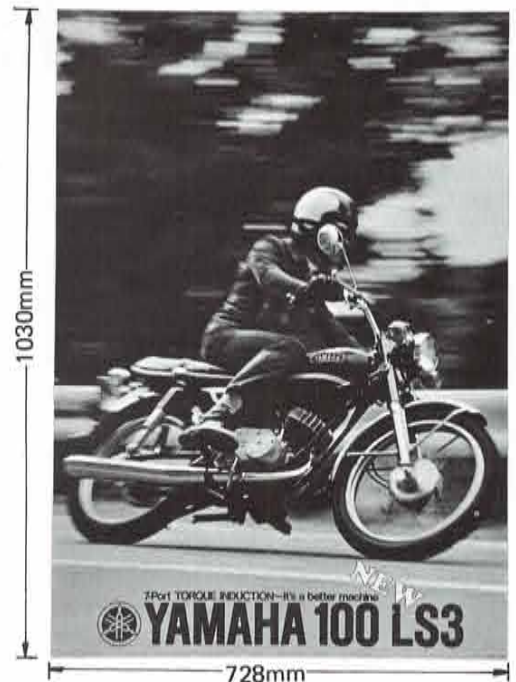
The Yamaha 100 Street LS3 is expected to be the forerunner of new Torque Induction engine-mounted street series.

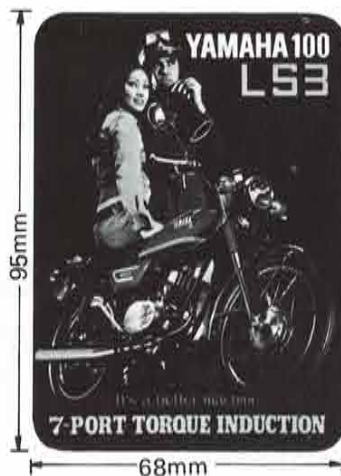

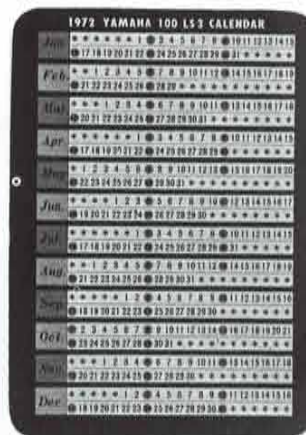

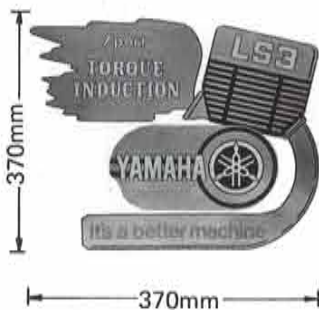

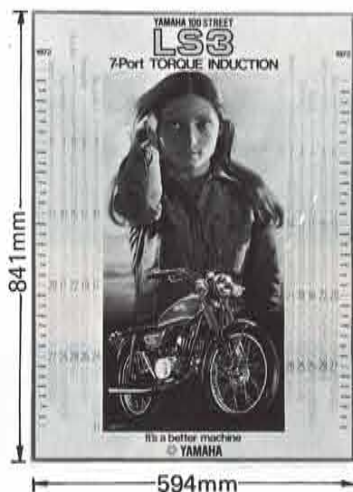

500cc World Motocross Series

Velthoven Rides Yamaha to Victory

Round 11, Luxembourg GP

J. van Velthoven, a Belgian star riding a Yamaha machine became the overall winner of the Luxembourg GP, final round of this year's 500cc MX world championship series which was staged on August 13. The race was run in the most terrible weather conditions. A thunderstorm with torrential rains before and during the first leg changed the hillside circuit into a quagmire. A. Jonsson riding a works Maico of West Germany streaked away first as soon as the first leg started. On lap second, another Maico rider A. Weil snatched the lead from his team-mate.

Velthoven was in steady pursuit of a leading pair of Maico riders. Jonsson succeeded in recapturing the lead halfway, and finished first with Velthoven securing a very safe 2nd place.

Only 17 riders contested the second leg. Again, Jonsson led the race very closely followed by Weil and Velthoven. Luck, however, turned against a Maico ace. Jonsson stooped on the very last lap, leaving first place to Weil. Velthoven again finished second. Two second places eventually earned this 21-year old Yamaha ace the first classic win.

H. Andersson's Success in Swedish GP

250cc MX World Championship Series

Yamaha machine ridden by H. Andersson of Sweden scored a win at the 250cc Swedish round on the very same day as the Luxembourg GP.

Andersson displayed his flawless skills on his home ground against powerful rivals on works Husquvarna machines. A. Kring proved to be the toughest rival throughout racing. He finished first at the first leg but

stood at second place at the second leg, while Andersson rode his Yamaha to second place at the first leg, and beat Kring at the second leg. Thus, both riders were tied at race results, but Andersson enjoyed 21-sec. advantage over a rival in total racing time. With this win Andersson climbed to second place in 250cc championship point table.

Trail School Opens —Australia

Australia is one of the most trail-enthusiastic countries in the world. Recently, the first session of trail school was organized by Willoughby District MCC Club at Amaroo Park, backed by McCulloch of Australia, distributors for Yamaha in New South Wales. Students were shown the basics of dirt riding, and practised their techniques under alert eyes of Yamaha instructors. Besides, they learnt a working knowledge of motorcycle control on unsealed surfaces. The session ended in a big success, and the school will run for more three sessions. Just for the first session, entry was restricted to Yamaha owners, but the school will eventually be opened to all trail enthusiasts, whether they ride Yamahas or not.



Learning new skills

A school for owners of Yamaha trail machines and staffed by Willoughby District MCC clubmen commenced at Amaroo Park on July 1.

Voiced a success by pupils and organizers alike the school will run for three more sessions. August 5, September 9, September 23. A decision will be made on its long-term future.

To date entry is restricted to Yamaha owners, but because of the project, McCulloch of Australia, distributors of the Japanese marque, indicate the school may be eventually opened to all makes of trail motorcycles.

Instruction of classes of up to 100 people is

"Students are shown the basics of dirt riding, practice the techniques under alert eyes of instructors, and at the end of the day should have absorbed a working knowledge of motor cycle control on unsealed surfaces.

Trail school teaches riding and ecology

"From then on the degree of proficiency attained depends on the amount of time the new rider is able to put into his riding and of course the individual's ability to improve.

"The school, I believe, is worthwhile because it offers the growing number of trail riders in this state somewhere to go where they can be shown by experts what to do in various situations that will confront them in a

day's trail riding. "There is no doubt that dirt riding knowledge will benefit the trail rider in day to day commuting also.

"Besides this the school also teaches a fairly hard-line doctrine on the ecology and conservation bit which we hope will ensure a future in this state for trail riding and not its demise which is threatened at this stage", Mr. Teschero said.

Traffic Broadcast Girls

Radio Station 4BK in Brisbane, Australia are using several Yamaha CS5E's equipped with two way radio and other minor accessories, ridden by 6 very attractive girls in very distinctive outfits. Their purpose is that during peak hour traffic hours, that is to say, early morning and early evening, they tour the main arterial roads of Brisbane, advising motorists of any road hazards, traffic jams or alternate routes to miss these jams or hazards.

During the normal day, they then patrol the Brisbane City areas, collecting information and advising mainly woman shop-

pers of parking availability and areas where parking can more easily be obtained. On top of this service, they are also used as mobile news reporters.

It is positively the first time ever that motorcycles have been used by radio stations for radio traffic broadcasts anywhere in the world. The use of motorcycles for this type of operation proves beneficial to the public. Excellent comments on this new service and Yamaha's reliable performance are received by Annand & Thompson Pty. Yamaha Motor Do Brazil has recently constructed a permanent motocross circuit called Yamaha Trail Landia in the suburbs of Sao Paulo, intending just to meet ever hotting up enthusiasm to motocross in this country.

The new circuit extends 1.6km, and is 50m wide at the start. The course opened with the 1st regional championship motocross meeting, and attracted approx. 8,000 spectators who intently watched 125cc and 250cc races. The number of spectators turned to be a new record for this type of sport event, thus reflecting great public interest in motocross. Every highlite scene was televised, and leading local paper Folha Da Tarde gave much space to this event.



Window Dressing Contest

In connection with the 1972 Wool Festival, New Zealand Retailers' Association promoted the nation-wide window dressing contest for professional window dressers. Mr. Russell Harris dressed his large department store with such an impressive display by combining a sheep with a Yamaha Trail HT1 which was offered by a Yamaha distributor.
